Capacity To Deal With New Housing Developments

This subject is complex as there are multiple factors to take into account including:-

- The demographics of the new patients.
- The remuneration these patients will bring.
- Our ability to recruit appropriately qualified staff.
- The development and implementation of new models of care in Norwich.
- The development of the Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP) across Norfolk.

These factors have the ability to increase and reduce demand on our resources as well as well as adjust our resources to cope with the changes. The timescales for any new development to be agreed and built out would mean that the new models of care and STP are likely to already be having an impact on how demand is satisfied.

I am aware that Norwich Clinical Commissioning Group are currently looking into proposed increases in demand on healthcare for the city as a whole due to planned large scale building around the north of the city.
